These carefully chosen, safely packaged items are yours to take—free! Stop by and pick up what you need.

Does your business have hazardous waste?

Businesses in Jackson and Josephine counties can take advantage of our special Conditionally Exempt Generator Day on Friday, May 7. This service is by application only and appointments are made in advance. Fees are charged according to the type and volume of the waste being disposed. If you are interested, please call us at 779-4161.

Waste prevention tips.

- Buy only what you need, then use it up.
- If you end up with products left over, share them with family, friends and neighbors.
- Read the labels before you buy. Watch for words like “danger,” “warning” and “caution.” Follow the directions carefully.
- Whenever possible, consider using a safer alternative.
- Dispose of these items safely—at our Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Event.

How much does it cost?

The minimum \$5 charge includes the first cubic yard of hazardous waste—a volume equal to six 32-gallon trash cans filled level. If you have more than one cubic yard of waste, your charge will increase accordingly.

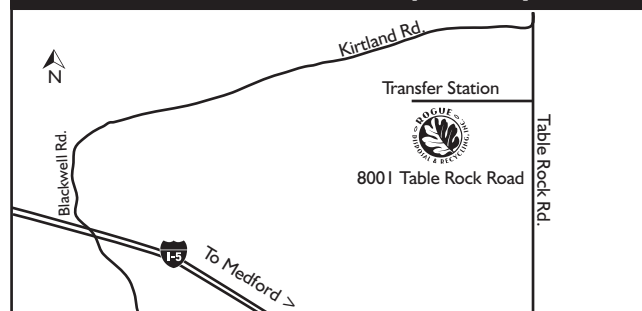

Nothing but latex paint.

If you've got a garage floor full of half-used latex paint cans, here's your chance to properly dispose of them. Rogue Disposal & Recycling is holding Latex Paint Drop-Off Days on Friday, April 30 and Saturday, May 1. We will be accepting any and all cans of latex paint at no cost. Indoor paint. Outdoor paint. Big cans, small cans, bright colors, pastel shades—any latex paint you've used around the house. (Sorry, this event is **NOT** open to businesses or commercial painters. No 55-gallon drums please!)

No oil-based paint, no empty cans.

Most latex paints will have words like "latex," "water-based" or "water clean-up" on the label. Oil-based paints will be marked with words such as "flammable" or "combustible" on the label. Because of their hazardous nature, oil-based paints will only be accepted at our Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off event.



Also, if you have paint cans that are empty or the paint has completely dried, you can throw them in with your regular trash. There's no need to make a special trip to dispose of empty cans.

Find what you need at the latex paint reuse table.

Looking for a mostly-full gallon of white paint? Maybe a pint or two of boysenberry semi-gloss? If you're getting rid of cans of paint that are more than half full and in good shape, bring them to our special latex paint table. While you're there, see if there's something you want. If there is, it's yours—free!

What to bring.

- Cleaning supplies (like window cleaners, drain cleaners, bathroom cleaners and any products containing bleach or ammonia)
- Old pesticides and insecticides
- Swimming pool chemicals
- Weed killers not currently approved for use
- Old lead and oil-base paint
- Old paint removers

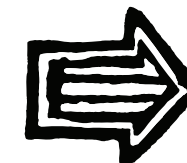
- Light ballasts
- Batteries
- Thermostats containing mercury

Trade in your mercury thermometer for a digital one—at no charge— at the Household Hazardous Waste Event.

If you've got an old mercury thermometer in your medicine cabinet, bring it to the Rogue Transfer Station on Table Rock Road, and we will exchange it for a new, safer digital thermometer—at no charge. One per customer, while supplies last.

What not to bring.

- No Fluorescent light tubes—use local recycle options
- No Medical or biological waste
- No Explosives
- No Radioactive materials
- No Ammunition
- No Commercial or industrial waste — this service is by application only!
- No Asbestos
- No Waste in containers larger than 5 gallons
- No 55-gallon drums
- No Propane tanks
- No Metal canisters/
fire extinguishers
